# Pacific Grove Museum of Natural History Director's Report January 2016

#### I. Executive Summary

Every program and department was bustling with activity in January. We hosted 735 students for field trips in the Museum, including students from Wisconsin, Livermore, Sacramento, Salinas, and more. Almost 600 people visited the Museum for our free Science Saturday event. This month the topic was "Migrations." Museum education programs served 929 students outside of the museum walls through our LiMPETS program and a collaborative program with the Monterey Peninsula Unified School District.

Our new geology exhibit, located on the mezzanine, opened in late January and features a thorough explanation of the unique geology of the Central Coast. Dr. Ed Clifton spoke in a lecture, "Life on the Edge" which attracted 130 visitors. We hosted a reception featuring paintings of California threatened and endangered birds by student artists from Santa Catalina School. Further, we installed a few collection paintings and a number of reproductions of collection paintings in in City Hall for the enjoyment of all who visit there.

Thanks to the generosity of a local Foundation, the old linoleum floor in the downstairs Education/Multi-purpose room was removed and new laminate flooring was installed.
